It is our honour to welcome you to ***the third Climate camp in the Czech Republic.*** This information booklet will be your guide to the whole camp. You will learn all you need to know about living in the camp and programme as well as details about the "Limity jsme my" climate justice movement. We have come here to meet, entertain and educate each other, and foremost to say clearly there is no space for fossil fuels in this world any more. Welcome to the place where we build a better world together!

Klimakemp is all of us. The camp is based on the principles of sustainability and solidarity and it will only work if we all participate in it. You will meet people and collectives who have various goals and are active both in the Czech Republic and abroad, but we are all united in our effort to stop climate change and create a better, just world. Only if we stand together can we build a world where everyone can live in dignity, regardless of their nationality, place of birth, gender, age or medical condition.

Klimakemp is supposed to create ***a safe and lively space to build the climate movement.*** So don't be afraid to take the initiative in creating its programme and improving the camps daily workings. If you decide together with other Klimakemp participants

WE ARE THE LIMITS!

"Limity jsme my" ("We Are the Limits") is an open, grassroots climate justice movement. We bring together individuals and groups fighting against climate change from all over the Czech Republic. The movement was founded in 2015 in reaction to a government proposal to break the limits of lignite mining in Northern Bohemia. In its worst scenario – with the expansion of the ČSA mine – this would mean the destruction of the town of Horní Jiřetín and nearby village of Černice. Together with thousands of people from all around the Czech Republic, we stood up against the planned mining expansion of the ČSA and Bílina mines. We organized demonstrations and rallies, and we collected signatures for a pledge of civil disobedience in case of destruction of settlements.

Even though we successfully managed to prevent the eviction of people from their homes, the government permitted the expansion of the Bílina mine, making additional 150 million more tonnes of lignite available to mining corporations. This was another reason why we decided to continue with our activities and make our anti-coal platform a part the global climate justice movement.

WHAT OUR GOAL IS

Climate change is the greatest threat to the future of the mankind. Scientists agree that human activity, predominantly burning of fossil fuels, is the principal cause of surging temperatures, rising sea levels, melting icebergs, waves of heat and droughts, devastating floods, increasingly more severe storms and extinction of species. The main goal of our movement is therefore **termination of mining and burning of coal and other fossil fuels, implementing climate justice, and a fair transition to a carbon-free economy.**

WHAT WE STAND FOR

We are part of a global movement. We are aware that climate change is a threat to our whole world. We feel to be a part of the rising movement for climate justice represented by groups such as Ende Gelände, The Rising Tide, Plane Stupid, 350.org and Reclaim the Power. We have participated in international events, such as Break Free from Fossil Fuels, where thousands of people blocked surface mining, coal terminals and construction of pipelines with their bodies. We intend to support protests against the fossil industry all over the world. Not only by a display of solidarity, but by physical participation as well. We want to learn from them and bring the global movement's tactics to the Czech Republic.

We are **standing in solidarity** with people who are most affected by climate change and environmental

injustice. We are aware that environmental problems cannot be separated from social and economic issues. Climate change replicates the distribution of power in society and deepens inequality on many levels. Climate change affects the poorest countries of the Global South the most, despite them contributing the least to global emissions. Similarly, the most polluted areas within individual countries are typically the ones with the greatest social problems. It is the people who are already poor and vulnerable, mostly women and people of colour, who suffer the worst from environmental disasters. Droughts and natural disasters are also one of the principal causes of migration forcing many people to leave their homes. These people must suffer the consequences of Global North's excessive emissions, when it is the global North that historically bears major responsibility for the damage caused by climate change. The time for a change has come.

HOW WE WORK AND WHAT WE DO

We work non-hierarchically, we do not have bosses and we are independent of political parties. Our aim is to build a grassroot environmental movement. Everyone who shares our values has an equal access to the decision making. The voice of those affected by environmental problems will be heard the most when they get the opportunity to actively participate in social movements activities, when they have a chance to come up with their own ideas and when they are empowered to carry them out.

We strive to be welcoming and inclusive, We will not tolerate racism, sexism nor any other forms of discrimination and oppression. Our movement is open to anyone regardless of the colour of their skin, their age or gender. We want to connect various social movements with ordinary people who suffer from mining, fossil fuels burning and consequences of climate change.

We stand for non-violence. We do not want to cause harm to any living beings by our actions. It is not our aim to damage the property of others either. Violence is not the way in which we want to advance our goals.

We stand for direct action. Radical politics intending to deal with the root causes of social injustice have never been successful without direct action. It was thanks to methods of direct action that women's suffrage, the eight-hour workday, and abolition of slavery and racial segregation have been won throughout history. For us, direct action is the main – although not the only – way to transformation and mobilization of people. By direct action, we mean for example non-violent blockades, passive resistance and civil disobedience. We are ready to actively and consciously confront laws and social conventions in the name of legitimate goals.

In organizing, we care about **sustainability of our activities.** We do not want to talk about a sustainable society - we want to live it. From the preparation of

food up to energy production and handling of waste, we want our actions to conform to the ideals we strive to achieve.

We want to change the system, not the climate!

KLIMAKEMPI!

WHY WE ORGANIZE IT AND HOW IT WORKS

Most importantly, Klimakemp is a place for **encounters**. It is meant to connect locals with city-based activists, and facilitate meeting of groups ranging from feminist collectives and social centres to well-established environmental NGOs. It is meant to get together Czechs with anti-coal activists from Germany, Poland, Austria, Slovakia and other countries.

Klimakemp is also a place for **sustainability**. It is a demonstration of a sustainable way of life – a utopia turned into a reality. We make our own energy from the sun using photovoltaic panels. We cook exclusively vegan food from local farms and shops. We sort our waste and compost all our food scraps. We built our own composting toilets.

Klimakemp is a place for **autonomy**. All participants of the camp have an opportunity to engage in decision-making about how the camp is working. This will be achieved with the help of regular public plenary meetings which take place in the circus tent every morning starting at 9 a.m. At the plenaries, we make decisions collectively, ideally in a way that produces a result agreeable to all participants.

Klimakemp is a place for bottom-up approach to **education**. Anyone has had an opportunity to shape its programme which you can find in this brochure, too. The camp aims to create a space where we can gain new knowledge and skillsets and where we can get fresh energy to keep fighting for climate justice.

Klimakemp is a place for **action**. Through creative and brave protests, we aim to stir up the fossilized public debate and make space in it for the discussion on climate change. We want to create dynamics that will allow us to make bottom-up pressure for society transformations and towards a just and sustainable future.

Klimakemp should also be a **celebration of life, art, and community**. For the whole time, we can collectively experience that a better world is possible. So let's make it worth it!

WHERE WE ARE

Climate change starts in places where the fossil industry mines and burns coal. We are located in the Pardubice Region, where the Chvaletice power station has been producing greenhouse gas emissions for over thirty years as one of the largest similar facilities of its kind in the country. The location in the Pardubice Region was selected for the construction by the previous regime in

the 1970s. The reason was the relief for the air in the severely tested region of Northern Bohemia. But the relief was only partial.

Since then, local people have had to breathe emissions coming from the Chvaletice power station, face impacts of climate change caused by coal burning, and on top of that, coal from the Northern Bohemia is still being brought here anyway, specifically from the ČSA and Vršany mines. In the past, coal was transported here on the Labe river, but shipping proved to be very expensive over time. Nowadays, coal is transported by trains, mainly thanks to the generous agreement between ČD Cargo and the owners of the power plant, notorious coal barons Pavel Tykač and Jan Dienstl, who own the Severní Energetická company. They acquired the power plant in 2013 when they bought it from the state-owned CEZ company. Instead of shutting it down, the new owners began to reconstruct the power plant behind the backs of the public in order to continue its malignant activity for decades. At present time, the plant owners are demanding an exemption from European emission limits to be implemented by 2021 so that they would not have to stop the operation of the Chvaletice plant.

Three years ago, twelve courageous people climbed to the power station's cooling tower to draw attention to the owners' efforts to extend the plant's life-cycle. Six of them still face criminal prosecution due to an alleged damage to a "public benefit utility". Although it is clear that the equipment causing climate change cannot be considered a public benefit. At present, they are awaiting the first trial and, in addition to a fine, they face a prison sentence. You can meet some of them at the campsite, please show them solidarity and synergy.

The Czech Republic operates a fleet of old coal-fired power plants with almost a fifth of all electricity being exported abroad. This equals the amount produced by three of the largest and one medium-sized coal-fired power plants in the Czech Republic. If we are to hope to reduce the impacts of climate change, we should start closing plants like Chvaletice. And that's why we are here to show that coal burning has to end!

We are in the Pardubice region, thanks to the helpfulness of some local opponents of mining, whom we thank very much. You can navigate around the camp by the map, which you will find in the info tent. There are different views on the operation of the Chvaletice power station in the region. Regardless of the differences of opinion, please treat the locals of the nearby villages with politeness and respect, as you are a visitor. Our opponents are the coal barons and mining companies, not their employees, and certainly not the inhabitants of the sites affected by their activities.

STAYING AT THE CAMP

The **infotent** is your gateway to Klimakemp. If you need any information, help, or advice, ask there. If necessary, you can reach the infotent at **+420 735 050 287**. You can also buy here useful things such as hygienic products, condoms and chocolate.

If you need to find your way, use the **map of the camp** that you'll find in there. It shows the tents of the shared infrastructure, and also the location to set up your own tent. You can also volunteer here if you want to help with various **activities and service** needed for the camp operation such as the **camp logistics, hygiene and kitchen**.

The camp also has **showers and toilets**. Please do not waste water when showering as others need a shower too. Our toilets are composting ones, so please follow their specific instructions: for example, remember not to place there anything but poop, toilet paper and sawdust into the toilet. **Don't forget to follow standard hygienic procedures like carefully washing your hands**, so that we can avoid potential problems of communal camp living. We kindly ask you to use exclusively biodegradable soaps – the water we use goes directly to the ground and nearby stream. No need to worry, soaps and hygienic gels will be available in common washing areas.

It is our collective responsibility to take care of our own safety as well as that of others. Don't hesitate to join the **security team or night watches**. All volunteers will receive necessary materials and instructions. Let's treat each other with respect, so we can enjoy our time together.

Please don't get near the **solar power station** and definitely don't touch it – even solar electricity is lethal in direct contact.

At the camp, various kitchen collectives will prepare and serve **food three times a day**. They will be very happy if you stop by and help them out a bit – whether with cooking or serving. **Recommended daily contribution for meal is 200 CZK (or 8 €) a day per person**. In case of special dietary needs, let the infotent staff know as soon as possible, so that we can secure food for everyone.

Besides the kitchen, you can find refreshments at the bar which is run by the Brno-based **co-op cafe "Tři Ocásci"**. You can expect good bottled beer, soft drinks and other goodies. Furthermore, there will be a stand with delicious **pancakes** for a voluntary contribution which will then be donated to support refugees. To cool down, you can have **ice cream** frozen by solar energy. Every treat made at Klimakemp

will be vegan and with extra added love.

Anytime you need, feel free to use the **chill out tent**. Just remember, it is meant strictly for relaxation, rest, repose, recline and relief. Keep in mind that ruckus, roaring, rioting, rumble or rumpus has no place in or nearby the chill out tent.

There is also a place where you can park your bike. If you didn't bring yours, you can borrow a bike and go for a trip. The bike facility is operated by two collectives – **Bike Kitchen Brno** and **Bike Kitchen Prague**.

You can also visit the **MamaTata collective** that organizes a children camp on the meadow. MamaTata is an autonomous collective that was a part of the Klinika social and cultural autonomous centre. It focuses on non-hierarchical education of children. They are going to have a workshop for children and their parents – painting banners and a discussion called **Parenthood in the Era of the Environmental Disaster** hosted by Apolena Rychlíková.

We have a special area for **children** where they can get toys and play in the shade. We do not organize baby-sitting though. If you need someone to baby-sit for you, please talk to other camp participants. Do not leave your children in the MamaTata camp.

Definitely **drop by the legal tent at least once**. You will have the opportunity to learn about your rights and obligations under various circumstances – from being randomly stopped in the street to being apprehended in an action of civil disobedience. Our lawyers will advise you what to do and what to avoid. The legal team's phone number is **+420910 128 501**.

Shall you at any point during the Klimakemp find yourself in a situation that you will find uncomfortable, confusing, or emotionally demanding or shall you ever just feel the need to talk to someone, don't hesitate to reach out to the **awareness team**. Don't forget to take care of your psychological comfort and general wellbeing. Experiences from Klimakemp or disobedient actions can be very intense and it is crucial to process them in healthy and appropriate ways. We can only save the world if manage to save ourselves.

KLIMAKEMP PROGRAMME

There will be several programme sections. We will start the day together in the circus tent with the open plenary session where we will discuss the most important things about the camp's operation. Ideally, we want every participant to join the plenary, or at least one representative of each affinity group. In this tent, there will also be lectures, discussions and workshops of the **main programme segment**. There will also be parallel events

in the programme tent. After the dinner, the circus tent will host the cultural programme.

Open space is another programme segment, created directly by the Klimakemp participants. It will take place in the second programme tent. If you have an idea for a programme activity you would like to do but you only got it right before or during the camp, you can join the programme group meeting (every day during the lunch) and we will consult where and when to do it.

As part of the **School of Civil Disobedience**, there will be action trainings and legal workshops. The meeting point for the action trainings is in front of the infotent; legal workshops will take place at the legal tent. We strongly recommend that you participate in both of them before joining a direct action of civil disobedience.

Besides these programme segments, there will also be other activities or in near the camp such as climbing workshops, making blocking aids and samba band rehearsals. Unless stated otherwise, the meeting point for these activities is in front of the infotent. You can also look forward to music, slam and other entertainment programmes in the circus tent in the evening.

Czech parts of the programme will be simultaneously interpreted into English and vice versa. If you want to help with interpreting, you can attend the simultaneous interpreting workshop in Sunday at 11 a.m. or you can apply for interpreting shifts at programme group meetings at lunchtime.

Taking care of the camp's operation is a part of the programme. The camp is not organized and run by a small group of people; we all create it together. There are no leaders or technicians, so we want all of you to join and help. **The camp will not work without your help.** You can find more details about possibilities to join at the infotent or during morning plenaries each day at 9 a.m.

CAMP LOGISTICS

The infrastructure was brought and built by a group of people, but the camp has no leaders and it is up to all of us to make it work. Anyone can help according to their skills and possibilities. Do you have a spare moment to help? Do you have an idea how to improve the camp's operation? Come to the infotent or let us know at the morning plenary in the circus tent.

What we appreciate the most is help with supplying **water** and **hygienic products**, taking out **waste** (including the contents of toilets – we will provide trainings for this because there is no camp without toilets) and you can also help in the **kitchen**.

WHERE DOES THE MONEY FOR KLIMAKEMP COME FROM?

Like in the previous years, a **volunteer finance group** of the Limity jsme my movement took care of fundraising. In collaboration with other working groups, the team has prepared the budget, addressed potential donors, organized crowdfunding and raised funds so that we could afford to have everything we need. After the Klimakemp, they will write final reports, do the accounts and so on. The finance group always welcomes new volunteers, whether you are experienced in fundraising and accountancy or not.

We would like to thank the Rosa Luxemburg Foundation for supporting the Summer School of Climate Justice. We also thank **Guerrilla Foundation** and companies **Patagonia** and **LUSH** for their long-term support of the Limity jsme my activities and climate justice movement. And special thanks go to hundreds of individual donors who make it possible to organize events like this camp as well as support people facing repression from the fossil industry and the state for being involved in civil disobedience actions.

If you want to contact the finance group, ask something about the funding or offer help, don't hesitate to talk to the members of the group – they will probably speak at some of the plenaries and inform about the camp's financial situation.

PARTICIPANTS' CONTRIBUTIONS

Like in the previous years, besides the long-term fundraising, Klimakemp also depends on participants' donations – mainly for the delicious food made by the volunteer Czech-German kitchen collective. We therefore suggest the daily contribution of about 200 Czech crowns (or approximately 8 euros). However, this is not a fixed "entry fee" – we want everyone to be able to come to Klimakemp, regardless of their financial situation.

CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE

Civil disobedience is a common and widely used method to stand against unjust or untenable actions. By non-violent rule breaking, we demonstrate that we are ready to bear the consequences of breaking the law in order to point out to a very serious problem ignored by the political and legislative powers.

It is generally agreed upon that humans cause climate change and that the emissions of carbon dioxide from fossil fuels need to be strictly reduced in the near future. It is also undeniable that the climate change negatively affects millions of people, mainly those who contributed to it the least. The extraction and burning of fossil fuels have a negative effect on the Czech landscape and damages the health of thousands of people. The Czech politicians as well as those abroad do not search for solutions - instead they keep giving empty promises while helping to facilitate further extraction and burning of fossil fuels, expansion of mines and selling old power plants to coal barons. The Paris Climate Conference brought an agreement to keep the warming under 1.5 degrees Celsius, but it doesn't appear to be actively implemented. That is an unbearable injustice.

To peacefully stand against the coal infrastructure might mean to commit a minor offence. However, it is legitimate and even necessary within the current political situation. It means to uphold the long tradition of civil disobedience which places individual consciousness above formal law as was the case of Charter 77 or the pre-revolution demonstrations for clean air in North Bohemia.

WHAT IS THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE CAMP AND THE ACTS OF CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE?

Klimakemp is a place that gives participants space for self-organization, networking and autonomous civic action. However, we strongly encourage participants of courageous and creative non-violent events to adhere unconditionally to the approved action consensus. It was created non-hierarchically, in discussions among the members of the movement defining the conditions under which they themselves are willing to perform similar activities. Anyone who breaks the action consensus cannot count on our support for our actions or their consequences.

WHAT IF I DON'T WANT TO PARTICIPATE IN THE CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE?

A legal demonstration will also take place within Klimakemp. Everyone will be given space for expression.

WHAT IF I HAVE NEVER PARTICIPATED IN CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE?

We also want that as many people as possible engage in civil disobedience in the Czech Republic. In the camp programme, there are several trainings which should prepare the participants for possible events of this type. Everyone should have the opportunity to acquire the knowledge needed for such activities from experienced participants.

WHAT IS AN AFFINITY GROUP AND DO I HAVE TO HAVE IT?

In terms of self-organization, it is best if you participate in legal demonstrations and non-violent civil disobedience in groups of four to ten people. These are called affinity groups. Within them, people trust each other, take care of themselves, make consensual decisions

and act together. The main thing is to have the same goal. The affinity group can send delegates a set of its decisions to the plenary, which then consensually decides on the collective action. If you do not have your affinity group yet, you will have enough opportunities to form one and practice in the camp. Be sure to participate in speed dating to find an affinity group on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Don't be afraid to reach someone directly at the campsite to advise you with non-hierarchical organizing. Its practical use is one of the goals of Klimakemp.

HOW TO ACT IN THE EVENT OF CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE.

We ask all those who would like to participate in civil disobedience to adhere to the proclaimed action consensus and, above all, to strictly respect the principle of non-violence. Next, always take care of your affinity group, primarily one of its members with whom you are paired as so-called buddies. We strongly advise you to take action training and consult legal matters at a legal workshop.

WHAT IF SOMETHING HAPPEN TO ME AT THE CAMP OR IN THE ACTION?

Emotional first aid

A trained group of emotional first aid will work at this year's Klimakemp. The Group provides a safe space for all people, regardless of gender, orientation, religion or nationality, and the ability to handle difficult topics and hurting experiences in empathic and healing interviews. The group maintains confidentiality and anonymity without exception. If you want to contact them, call +420 735 512 950.

The group presents itself with the following text:

The limits of emotions

To have an attitude and to be able to stand up for it is a thing that most people never dare do.

It is often the case that one gets punished or stigmatized, no matter how legitimate their actions are. Whether this means finding yourself in a situation where someone is humiliating us, whether it means that we are physically attacked or threatened by subsequent repression, it is clear that we are taking away the scars.

Sometimes the scars are visible and it is easy for people around us to recognize that something unpleasant has happened to us.

Sometimes the scars are not visible, but they hurt us the same way. Although it is often difficult to talk about your injuries, it can be a way to let them heal. Like putting a broken arm in plaster, the soul sometimes needs support from the outside. We would like to give this emotional plaster to all who need it. Plaster in the form of listening, peace and safety. And so we will be happy if you want to take advantage of this offer. Because we all feel weak sometimes, and it's fine.

There is also a medical team that will give you a helping hand if needed. You can find them in a health tent or call them, you will find the number in their tent and in the info card.



ACTION CONSENSUS

FOR POSSIBLE NON-VIOLENT CIVIL DISOBEDIENCE ACTIONS DURING 2019 KLIMAKEMP

The year 2018 was again one of the hottest years in the recorded history. Scientists agree that our planet is warming rapidly. To avoid a catastrophic temperature increase of more than 1,5 degrees Celsius, it is crucial to radically reduce greenhouse gas emissions and keep at least 80% of all known fossil fuels under the surface. However, fossil companies plan to extract and burn them.

Considering the urgency of the climate crisis and politicians' long-term unwillingness to solve this problem, we decided again to take action. During the Czech Climate Camp, we are going to take non-violent civil disobedience actions against one of the coal infrastructures in the region. **For a moment, we are going to become limits of coal mining and burning, as it is the main source of the climate change and its dramatic consequences.**

The planned action is a publicly announced act of civil disobedience directed against one of the local coal infrastructures. Anyone can take part regardless their previous experience with similar protests. We are going to participate in legal demonstrations or in more daring non-violent actions of civil disobedience against one of the local coal infrastructures. **We will prepare for the action through a training, we will learn to organize ourselves in affinity groups, to take decisions non-hierarchically and to block effectively. We will stay calm and non-violent.** We won't provoke escalation so that we wouldn't endanger anyone.

We will block and occupy only with our own bodies or equipment for passive resistance; we won't destroy or damage any equipment. We will go along the police lines or barriers and we will avoid any physical contact with the police and security guards. **In all circumstances, we will follow the principles of nonviolence, we won't react to any possible provocations.** Our action is directed against neither coal industry workers, nor the police. The safety of all participants and workers will be our top priority. We will try to make the action as creative and accessible to broader public as possible.

All together we take the responsibility for the success of the action and we will support each other. **Should anyone consciously break this action consensus, they cannot claim the right to support from the others in case of any legal, financial and other consequences of the action.**

We are the limits of the fossil industry!

AND WHAT'S NEXT? LET'S WRITE THE FUTURE TOGETHER!

Thanks for reading up to here.

In the last year, we have been able to see signs of the climate crisis in the Czech Republic here and now. More and more people are perceiving the seriousness of the problem and trying to be part of the solution.

From the climate crisis, even in the Czech public the climate movement is becoming a real force. But this didn't happen on its own. It is due to all those who have recently been involved in various activities to end the burning of fossil fuels and the fair transition to renewable energy.

We are glad you decided to join them at Klimakemp 2019. But it doesn't all end by this year's Klimakemp. Only if we work on it for a long time, can we gradually gain more power than the fossil industry has in society - and there is not much time left for us. The good news is that there are social movements - to help people get such strength together.


